MERCY Malaysia is a registered society under the Societies Act 1966 (Societies Reg. No. 1155).

To date, MERCY Malaysia has over 500 members and is supported by approximately 5,000 registered volunteers in our database.

In compliance with the Societies Act, MERCY Malaysia submits its account to an external auditor, publishes its Annual Report for review and holds Annual General Meeting usually in the months of June of every year.



The MERCY Malaysia footprint of timely, non-denominational medical relief saw us aid beneficiaries from all around the world. In 2013, we helped citizens from 15 countries get back on their feet.

As part of our commitment to the Humanitarian Accountability Partnership, MERCY Malaysia publishes its Annual Report which includes Financial Statement for public review





The **Humanitarian Accountability Partnership** was officially registered in Geneva, Switzerland, in March 2003 its purpose of achieving and promoting the highest principles of accountability through self-regulation by members.

In 2007, MERCY Malaysia took a significant step towards allowing itself to be guided and audited in the practice of good governance and transparency by becoming a member of the HAP.

In 2011, it marks a significant year once again for MERCY Malaysia when it was successful in it's bid to acquire the HAP re-certification



1st in Asia, 3rd International Non-Governmental to be certified by HAP Humanitarian Accountability and Quality Management Standard.

This is the only aid standard developed in this way and which meets the ISO guidelines for designing quality standards.

This marks as an achievement for MERCY Malaysia in its effort to expand humanitarian relief in an accountable and transparent manner.

MERCY Malaysia Extends Help to Survivors Of Typhoon Haiyan in Ormoc Provincial Hospital, Ormoc City By Cash donations:

KUALA LUMPUR, 20th of November - MERCY Malaysia's relief team is currently based in Ormoc District Hospital, Ormoc City where they have set up an emergency services to provide outpatient treatment for those who have been affected by Typhoon Haiyan.

According to a report by the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA), 13.2 million have been affected, 4.4 million displaced and 1.1 million houses damaged.
