Preamble

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Constitution (Amendment) (No.2) Act 1984, [Act A585] the Yang di-Pertuan Agong makes the following order:

Order 1. Citation.

(1) This order may be cited as the **Federal Territory of Labuan (Extension and Modification of Registration of Business Act) Order 1996**

Order 2. Extension and modification.

The Registration of Businesses Act 1956, [Act 197], which in this Order is referred to as the "extended Act" and any subsidiary legislation made thereunder, as modified in the manner set out in the Schedule, are extended to the Federal Territory of Labuan:

Provided that any person holding a valid licence under the Trades Licensing Ordinance at the commencement of this Order shall be given until 30 June 1996, or such further period as the Minister may by order published in the *Gazette* prescribe, to register his business in accordance with section 5 of the extended Act.

Order 3. Non application.

Subsection 5(5) and section 23 of the extended Act shall not apply to the Federal Territory of Labuan.

Order 4. Modification of forms.

The forms set out in the Schedule to the Registration of Businesses Rules 1957[L.N. 282/57] shall apply with any necessary modifications.
